The Triad consists of three notes, and three intervals: two m3's, and one 5th.

The Chords are represented with roman numerals, large for major, small for minor:

I, ii, iii, IV, V, vi, viio, I.

The o stands for diminished, these are the naturally occurring chords in any Major key.
